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



MONCHIERO | PIEDMONT, ITALY



In Castiglione Falleto, in the heart of the Barolo region, the Monchiero family established their wine business in the 1950s, initially only selling their grapes, but by the 1970s making their own wine. Vittorio Monchiero has been at the helm since the 1980s, whilst his son Luca has recently joined the business. The estate's wines are very pure, open expressions of Barbera and Nebbiolo, with some exceptional Barolo made here. Monchiero's white, from Piemontese speciality Arneis is crisp, aromatic and delicious.

FINE WINE NEWS

As 2019 continues apace, Mr. Wheeler's fine wine department has continued to grow and indeed, flourish since the turn of the year.

Writing this in March 2019, Martin Wheatley has looked at a few key campaigns for the year, as a whole. For the very latest, in what is a very fast-paced market, please don't hesitate to contact Martin directly to be added to our distribution list.

2017 BURGUNDY

The worldwide release of 2017 Burgundy was met with keen demand from Merchants and private buyers alike. The vintage offered a sensationally supple, modern classic of a year and was equally successful for both pinot noir and chardonnay across the length of the Côte d'Or and Chablis. High quality was also combined with the rarest of Burgundian traits; good volume. Highlights for me included the addition of Chablis's Samuel Billaud and Gevrey superstar Sylvie Esmonin to our offer for the first time, together with another dizzying performance from the irrepressible Domaine Heresztyn-Mazzini also from Gevrey-Chambertin. If you have not already, I urge you to consider tucking a case or two away here as the wines in 2017 are simply divine.

SUPER-TUSCANS

In recent years we have seen burgeoning demand for the greatest wines of Tuscany, particularly the twin vintages of 2015 and 2016 which have really ignited the imagination of buyers around the world. With the top wines of each vintage performing spectacularly in critics' eyes, the considerations of drinking versus wine investment have never before been so closely fought! The historic names of Sassicaia, Ornellaia, Solaia and Tignanello are bywords for quality, pedigree and historical success on the world stage. Add to this famous group releases such as Donna Olimpia's Millepassi and Petrolo's "Pomerol clone" Galatrona and you have all the ingredients for continued growth and development in this hugely exciting region. Mr.Wheeler has privileged access to all of these wines and more, and with the lion's share of the splendid 2016 releases still to come, do let me know if you are keen to secure an allocation and I will be delighted to assist.

2018 BORDEAUX

At the time of writing the Mr.Wheeler team is preparing to pack their overnight bags for a swift sojourn to this most noble of regions. Following what can only be described as a stunning summer across Europe, our hopes are extremely high for a vintage of great quality within the major communes of Bordeaux. If the rumblings making their way through social media are anything to go by, we have an amazing vintage on our hands. To put 2018 Bordeaux into context at this

point in time; in the words of Oliver Bernard, owner of Classed Growth Domaine de Chevalier in Pessac-Léognan, "This year is the best vintage of my life". Some praise indeed, and the bar has very much been set. We look forward to communicating our view of this exciting vintage over the coming weeks and months.

2008 VINTAGE CHAMPAGNE

For those of you looking for a little sparkle in your wine collections, 2019 has also delivered a handful of truly exceptional vintage Champagne releases from the otherworldly 2008 vintage. Occasionally, when perfect growing conditions permit, vintages such as this transcend the potential of a region and realign your perspective of greatness. Universally declared as the greatest release since the legendary vintages of 1990, 1996 and 2002; 2008 delivers fruit intensity and acid balance of the very highest level. With dynamic poise and significant aging potential allied to exceptional worldwide demand, these are wines which any serious wine lover should own. Mr.Wheeler has had notable success offering 2008 Bollinger Grande Année, 2008 Dom Pérignon and the simply stunning 2008 Winston Churchill from Pol Roger. Whether purchased for early drinking, with a view to let them mature longer, or even with investment in mind, these singular 2008s will reward at every single turn. Put simply, this is a vintage not to miss and with allocations already dwindling, an early expression of interest on any upcoming releases is highly recommended.

SOURCING PRIVATE COLLECTIONS

Looking beyond En Primeur, Mr.Wheeler has a great deal of success travelling around the country assessing and valuing private customer's wine cellars. From vintage Port, to flights of Penfold's Grange, d'Yquem and Mouton-Rothschild, we have been busily adding great bottles to our Dedham shop and website for our customers to enjoy.

It seems remiss not to take this opportunity to remind our readers that we are always on the lookout for well cared for, expertly cellared wines in great condition. 

WINE HISTORY

We do like a bit of history here at Mr. Wheeler - obviously going back to 1883 we have a fair bit of heritage ourselves, and we do have a couple of ex-history students in the team. Whilst researching wine facts for this publication, a couple of interesting wine stories came to mind, which we thought worthy of a little more attention...

NINETEETH CENTURY FOOD AND WINE **MATCHING**

Copies of the 1870 Christmas Day menu from a smart Paris hotel are still in existence and make for fascinating reading. In December 1870 Paris was under siege by the Prussian army. The French army had been defeated and the emperor Napoleon III captured – Paris had not yet surrendered but was surrounded and starving. As food ran out, beleaguered residents took to eating pets, vermin, and in some cases even each other.

For the wealthier inhabitants of the city, starvation rations were a little more exotic. Most of the residents of the Paris zoo were butchered, and a number were purchased by luxury hotels such as this. The bill of fayre for Christmas Day 1870 includes such delicacies as; Stuffed donkey's head, elephant consommé, roast camel 'a l'anglaise', kangaroo, haunch of bear, terrine of antelope with truffles and roast wolf in deer sauce. Most enticing of all is undoubtedly cat served with rats!

Slightly easier on the eye, and stomach, is the list of wines served alongside this feast; As well as an unspecified sherry, the first flight includes Bordeaux royalty in 1861 Château Latour Blanche and 1864 Château Palmer (a little on the young side perhaps?) The second flight takes things up a notch, featuring 1846 Château Mouton-Rothschild and 1858 Romanée-Conti (the 2015 vintage sells at an astonishing £25,000 a bottle)! Obviously, the diners had to 'slum it' a little - Mouton was, at the time, only a second growth, not the 1er Cru Classé it is today. Unsurprisingly, they were still able to rustle up a passable dessert and cheeseboard under the circumstances, and the meal finishes with a Bollenger (sic), Frappé and an 1827 'Grand Porto'.

Apparently, the monkeys of the zoo were spared, as they were considered a little too close to human to consume. The hippopotamus was also passed because the 80,000 francs demanded for it was above the reach of any of the butchers. (According to the internet, that's about £340,000 in today's money)

So, whilst the commoners of Paris were genuinely starving, the well-to-do were still able to eat in relative, if unconventional, luxury. There is no price shown on the menu, so one can only assume that the old adage applies "if you need to ask the price..."

This fascinating document does illustrate the enduring cultural significance of wine whatever the circumstances under which we might be drinking it – under shellfire in this case, and with some particularly challenging food matches, it has always been important to choose better wine.

'BURIED' TREASURE

All of this piqued my interest, and I was intriqued to find out about other historical wine lists. 'What about the Titanic?' I thought. Annoyingly, although detailed menus are available from the doomed ship's first-class restaurant, any kind of wine list is frustratingly unspecific. What is documented is that the Titanic was carrying 1,500 cases of Champagne, Bordeaux, Burgundy, Sauternes, Mosel and Port – which doesn't seem a great deal, but perhaps the ill-fated wine cellar was due to be re-stocked in New York for the return voyage.


The one wine which is mentioned specifically amongst the cargo is Heidseick & Co. 'Goût Américaine' Champagne (a sweeter style, popular in the early decades of the twentieth century). Apparently bottles of this have been salvaged intact from the seabed and opened for examination – sadly without showing significant signs of improvement after 100 years underwater!

THE FIRST FIZZ?

Legend has it that Benedictine monk Dom Pérignon 'invented' the Champagne method of production in the region in the late seventeenth century exclaiming "Come quickly, I am tasting the stars!". But the region of Limoux, in France's Languedoc, claims to have pioneered the process around 150 years earlier in 1531 (a date which today is used extensively by Crémant de Limoux producers in their marketing). It is alleged by some wine historians that Dom Pérignon made a pilgrimage south to the Limoux region, and brought the idea back to Champagne with him.

SOUTH AMERICA

NEW ZEALAND: A BRIGHT FUTURE AT 200



This year, New Zealand is celebrating 200 years since the country's first vines took root. In September 1819, Yorkshire man and Christian missionary Samuel Marsden planted 100 vines in New Zealand's far north but it would take a long time for a true wine industry to flourish.

Pioneers and visionaries came and went over the next 150 years with early predictions that New Zealand would soon become a great wine producing nation as accurate as Nostradamus's prophecy that the world would come to an end in 1999.

A nation dominated by beer and whisky-swilling British immigrants didn't help New Zealand's wine's fortunes nor did strict government legislation regarding the sale of wine. It wasn't until the 1960s and 1970s that any semblance of a wine culture began to form with a generation of young Kiwis travelling to Europe for working holidays, the creation of food and wine societies in the urban centres, and alcohol laws becoming more relaxed.



It is astonishing how far New Zealand has come in such a short time: the first Sauvignon Blanc was planted in Marlborough in 1975 - within a decade, its distinctive aromas had woken up the palates of international critics. In his autobiography A Life in Wine, Hugh Johnson remembers, "This was Sauvignon Blanc with the volume turned up. I remember the surge of scent, the snap on the tongue, the hundredamp shock through the system. Like Sauvignon or hate it, here it was in primary colours."

Instead of turning its nose up, the wine world turned its attentions on this land at the bottom of the earth. In the 20 years since Nostradamus predicted the world was going to end, New Zealand's vineyard area has more than tripled in size and its vineyards, winemakers and wines are coming of age. In the world of wine, New Zealand remains the new kid on the block. However, the first generation of this modern era, who are heading towards pension age, now have several decades of experience and understand their sites and vines. This confidence in their vineyards has led to a general move away from hands-on winemaking. It is increasingly common to find wines that have taken months to complete their wild ferments, little or no sulphur used during the winemaking process, and bottles whose contents have not been fined nor filtered, leaving all the good stuff in.

While the New Zealand wine scene's image might be slightly safe compared with the more ballsy Australians across the Tasman Sea, there's a new generation of young producers pushing boundaries further whether it's experimenting with varieties including Grüner Veltliner and Albariño, making unconventional blends, fermenting wines in the vineyard, or pushing winemaking techniques to the limit whether that's 100% whole bunch fermentation Pinot Noirs or skin-contact Sauvignon Blancs.



Lured by the beauty of its wines, the beauty of its land and its remoteness, it is unsurprising that wealthy overseas investors are looking to New Zealand rather than overpriced Burgundy or Bordeaux to buy a piece of dirt. While New Zealand's Overseas Investment Office has to approve purchases by non New Zealanders, around one-third of New Zealand wine production is controlled by foreign owners. They join the United Nations of New Zealand wine: a young grape-growing country shaped by newcomers with a dream.

The cost of the bottle, label and shipping etc does not change, irrespective of the bottle price; and duty remains the same, as does VAT at 20% of the purchase price. So the additional investment is firmly on the actual wine, the grapes, the vineyard and heritage of the product.

100% of the wines that we stock are wines that are bottled at source. Bottling wine at source is proven to deliver a better quality. There are a few exceptions to this, but if you look carefully at many of the supermarket wines (certainly those below £7) you will see they are UK bottled on an industrial scale, with the product shipped to the factory in large tanks.

Wine producing is an art and it is our belief that the grower is absolutely the best person to be bottling the wine, and that bottling at source is a key part of the overall wine supply chain. The care and control that the producer of the wine will have in this process is crucial to the end result. In addition, this process provides jobs and opportunity to the region from which the grapes are grown, which is critical from a sustainability, traceability and provenance perspective.



Last year saw the most expensive single bottle of wine ever sold at auction, a bottle of 1945 Grand Cru Romanée-Conti, which sold at Sotheby's in October for a whopping \$558,000, which was over 17 times its original estimate of \$32,000! A previous recordholder was a £225,000 bottle of 1787 Château Margaux, inscribed with the intials THJ, having purportedly originally come from the cellar of US founding father Thomas Jefferson.

It was due to be opened at a gala dinner in New York in 1989, but was knocked over by a waiter and smashed!

WHEELER FAMILY VINEYARDS

My wife Carine and I are Pinot Noir devotees and are very passionate about our own vineyard holdings; mine in Marlborough, New Zealand and hers in Champagne.

Managed in partnership with Swiss winemaker Georg Fromm, Clayvin Vineyard was first planted in 1991 and was the first 'hillside' vineyard to be cultivated in the beautiful Marlborough region at the top of the New Zealand's South Island.

The exceptional characteristics of this vineyard are its terroir, location and unique closeplanting as found in the best sites of Burgundy. Located on the north-facing slopes of the Brancott Valley in Marlborough, the Clayvin Vineyard takes its name from the clay-based subsoil that lies beneath the vineyard. This site has consistently produced wines which have attracted worldwide attention and acclaim, and as the vines age, the wines go from strength

to strength with each vintage. As well as pinot noir, very good chardonnay and also syrah are grown here. A second label Moa Ridge is also made, using the younger chardonnay and pinot vines from the Clayvin vineyard.

Carine's family also specialises in pinot noir. and produces their Champagne Michel Guilleminot in the Aube Valley, at the very far south of Champagne. This is a high-class 'Récoltant-Manipulant' Champagne which means they grow all their own grapes and bottle all their own wines, ensuring great character, provenance and individuality. A family-run business, led by Corinne and Patrice Guilleminot who represent the 4th generation, Champagne Guilleminot's vines are in prime

pinot noir territory – the Aube Valley's Côte des Bars is almost in Burgundy.

Whereas pinot meunier and chardonnay are grown elsewhere in Champagne, Carine's parents Michel and Colette decided to plant their vineyard solely with pinot noir, creating their signature Blanc de Noirs style.

After bottling, Champagne Guilleminot rests peacefully on its lees for a minimum of three years during which time the Champagne softens, and gains richness and texture and fine balance. This is a high quality Champagne, which always performs well in blind tastings against the more famous Grande Marque names.

THE RISE OF ENGLISH WINE

English wines are on a roll - this year it is estimated that another two million vines will be planted. England's vineyards have doubled in size in the past 8 years and tripled since 2000. There are currently 7,000 acres under vine across 164 wineries and a record breaking 15.6 million bottles were produced in 2018, 130% higher than the previous year's crop in 2017 and far exceeding the previous record of 6.3m bottles in 2014.

A recent study suggested that there are approximately 70,000 acres of land that may be highly suitable for vine plantation. By 2040, there could be 40 million bottles produced creating a market worth over £1bn (by comparison Champagne produces over 500 million bottles per year). Gosh.

It is not only English and Welsh producers who are planting new vineyards. French champagne houses are moving in, with Tattinger the first to buy land in Kent, followed by Pommery's venture in Hampshire and more are sure to follow...

Our marginal climate is better suited to sparkling wine varietals, so it is not surprising to find that 68% of bottles produced are sparkling with the classic grape varieties Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier

accounting for over 71% of all grapes planted. Of course, it helps when both the Queen and Downing Street assist with the PR -Buckingham Palace have served sparkling wines from Gusbourne Estate (Kent) and Ridgeview (in the South Downs) at state banquets and Chapel Down (also in Kent) is an official supplier to No.10.

Sparkling wine producers continue to innovate. Flint Vineyards in Norfolk and Fitz in Sussex are now producing Prosecco-style, more fruit-driven sparkling wines using the Charmat method (secondary fermentation in tank rather than the traditional method in bottle).

Clearly, it isn't only all about the sparkling stuff. Still wines continue to improve in quality with some excellent Pinot Noir and Bacchus wines now being produced. The New Hall Bacchus

Reserve we feature as one of our go-to wines is regularly praised in the press, with The Times' Jane MacQuitty being a big fan.

Helping to drive the growth of English wines is wine tourism, where there is a thriving scene offering an experience once reserved for trips overseas. This year, clusters of vineyards in the winelands of England are promoting their regions as go to places to visit – and we suggest you do exactly that. So, pick up your secateurs and enjoy a visit to a vineyard and in the meantime, we encourage you to taste an English bottle or three when you next order from us.

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

A number of the best-known grape varieties can be found with alternative names depending on where in the world they are grown, or sometimes the style in which they are made. shiraz is very widely seen in the New World, but when grown in Europe, or made in a more European style it is more commonly found with its 'original' name syrah.

Malbec can sometimes be found in France with its 'old' name côt, chenin blanc can be found in South Africa as steen, and zinfandel, most often emanating from California is believed by many to be the same grape as Southern Italy's primitivo.

A - Z GLOSSARY

We're all familiar with the reputation of viniculture and its association with the inexplicable terminology and impossible rhetoric of pretentious wine pseuds. But at Mr. Wheeler, we feel that fine wine and the lexicon that orbits it really needn't be so impenetrable. Wine often speaks for itself when you sip.

Even so, because we choose better wine at Mr. Wheeler, we think some wine terms are worth defining in an accessible and understandable way. We want to help wine lovers expand their oenological vocabulary along with their palate. Here's our first A - Z glossary of useful wine terms:

ACIDITY: The crucial ingredient determining a wine's freshness. If the FULL-BODIED: A term used to describe a bigger style, rounded and acidity is excessive, the wine will taste tart and sour. Too little acidity will result in dull, dreary, lifeless wine.

AERATION: This is all about the process of getting oxygen into a wine to allow it to breathe. Simply pulling the cork out of a bottle and leaving a bottle open for a period will make very little impact. Decanting a wine or pouring it into a jug and back into a bottle will have a much greater impact. The goal is to cause a wine to open up and in turn begin to develop.

APPELLATION: The French term that defines a specific area where a wine's grapes were grown, for example Bordeaux, Gevrey-Chambertin, or Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Each appellation with have its own regulations and rules that cover everything from which varieties can be planted to how the vines must be planted.

BALANCE: Winemakers consider this the holy grail. Balance refers to the harmonious blending of a wine's acidity, alcohol level, fruitiness

BARREL AGED: This describes a wine that has spent a period of time in an oak barrel prior to bottling. This can affect the wine in numerous ways, softening tannins, adding flavour and enriching the body.

BIG: Not a reference to the size of the bottle but a description of the size of flavour in your mouth. This doesn't necessarily mean fruitiness. Plentiful tannins can lend wine a big flavour, too.

BODEGA: Spanish for wine cellar or wine warehouse. A wine estate producing wine, for example Bodegas Benito Urbina.

BODY: The impression of weight or fullness of a wine. A full-bodied wine may leave a bigger impression than a light bodied wine, but it is not necessarily a reflection of a wine's quality or resulting taste.

BLENDING: The art of combining more than one grape variety with another in the production of a single wine using varying quantities of each. Wines can be blended for many reasons usually however blending is primarily used to produce wines with more layers, complexities or character. Almost all the wines of Bordeaux are blends made up primarily of Cabernet Sauvignon and merlot.

BOND: Wines held 'under bond' are stored securely in a customs approved warehouse. The duty and VAT payable on any wines held 'under bond' is not required until their removal from this facility i.e when they are required by a customer.

BOTRYTIS CINEREA OR "NOBLE ROT": A mould that under specific conditions of humidity and warmth can grow on ripe wine grapes. The mould causes a dehydrating effect on the grapes, leaving them shrivelled and raisin like. This in turn concentrates the grape sugars and flavours in the grapes. Subsequently wines made from these berries can have a very rich, honeyed character with high levels of residual sugar making them sweet. The best-known examples are the white Sauternes of Bordeaux and the famous Tokaji's of Hungary.

CHEWY TANNINS: Ingredients in certain wines that dry out the mouth as it passes over the tongue, making you "chew" and salivate to clear these tannins from the sides of your mouth.

CLUNKY: The opposite of balance. A clunky wine either has too much fruit and too little acidity or too much acid and too little fruit and tannins.

CORKED: Term commonly used to describe any faulty bottle however the true definition describes a wine that has an off-putting, musty or mouldy aroma or flavour which is caused by a tainted cork.

DENSE: Take a sip of Côtes du Rhône, Brunello di Montalcino or cabernet sauvignon and you'll know what this term means. It's shorthand for "bold red wine" (but beware: in other wines that are meant to be lighter, it usually means the wine is handicapped in some way).

DOMAINE: An estate, vineyard or territory that produces wine – typically associated with the wineries of Burgundy.

DRY: A wine described as dry has no perceptible taste of sugar. While a dry wine may still have some residual sugar left it is too small to give the consumer any sense of sweetness.

DUTY: UK duty is payable on every bottle of wine that we sell. however it is a flat fee meaning you pay the same amount per bottle regardless of how expensive or not a wine is. This means you actually pay proportionally less the more expensive a wine is making the better-quality wines even better value than the cheaper ones.

EARTHY: Describes the flavours or aromas of soil or earth which can add a complexity or depth to a wine. However excessive levels can lead to a wine tasting dry or old.

EN PRIMEUR: The method of buying wine before it is bottled and released for general purchase. Wine is usually shipped two springs after release, for example 2016 Bordeaux was released in late spring 2017 and will be shipped in the spring of 2019.

FINISH: Not a reference to the sad moment when the bottle is empty, but a term referring to how long the wine flavour lingers (sometimes known as a wine's "length"). A wine that lingers pleasantly, yielding layers of fruit, might be described as possessing "a satisfyingly long,

often rich tasting wine that leaves you with a mouth filling sensation of weight.

GRIP (OR "GRIPPY TANNINS"): these wines can only be sipped slowly (as opposed to swallow smoothly) because the kind of tannins they contain dry your mouth further and further with every subsequent sip.

HECTARE: unit of measurement of land commonly used to describe the size of a vineyard. It 1 hectare is equivalent to 10,000 square meters or 2.47 acres.

HERBACEOUS: literally, the pleasing presence of an herbaceous flavour, ranging from thyme to lavender to fennel.

HINT: When sommeliers use the phrase "This wine has a hint of," they mean that a subtle but detectable flavour (e.g., citrus, oak, fruits, herbs, earthiness, etc.) will emerge upon sipping, especially on the

IMPERIAL: Wine bottle containing six litres (equivalent to eight standard 750ml bottles)

INTENSITY: A reference to the sensual impact of a wine's balance of fruitiness, fragrance, alcohol level and tannin level. For example, "Guigal Côtes du Rhône has aromatic intensity.'

JAMMY: Red wines that have been produced in very hot climates can sometimes taste a little thick and syrupy and the fruit can tend to taste a little cooked rather than fresh, while generally this is not a great characteristic it can add a bit of extra depth to a wine.

JEROBOAM: A wine bottle holding 3 litres of sparkling wine/ Champagne, or a wine bottle holding 4.5 litres of still wine. A 3-litre bottle of still wine is often referred to as a jeroboam but is technically a double magnum.

LATE HARVEST WINE: This is a clue that the wine you're about to slurp is going to be luxuriously sweet (usually, a dessert wine) because, as the name implies, grapes have been left on the vine until late in the picking season and so are particularly ripe and therefore contain high levels of grape sugar

LAY(ING) DOWN: The process of keeping fine wine in storage to mature, either to be enjoyed or to be re-sold in future.

LEES: Dead yeast cells left remaining in a barrel or tank during or after fermentation. These are usually racked off however occasionally they may be left to enrich a wines character and assist aging (see "sur lie").

 $\ensuremath{\textbf{LINEAR:}}$ Wine possessing a pleasingly defined level of acidity that delivers a focused, lively taste

MACERATION: Process primarily used in the production of red wine. Maceration involves in interaction of the grape skins and solids with the wine juice after fermentation, during which time the alcohol acts as a solvent aided by heat to extract both colour and tannins from the skin. Cold maceration does not require heat and takes place before fermentation instead.

MAGNUM: This refers to a bottle with a capacity of 1.5 litres. A double magnum contains 3 litres of wine (equivalent to four standard

MATURE(ING): The ageing process that develops the depth of flavours and aromas in wine. A wine at "the peak of its maturity" is often at its best, with the right balance of flavour and aroma.

NEBUCHADNEZZAR: Storing positively gargantuan 15 litres of wine, this is the largest wine bottle size of all (equivalent to twenty standard 750ml bottles).

NEW WORLD WINE: Wines produced in countries or regions outside the traditional wine-growing areas (Europe and the Middle East) where winemaking originated. New World Wines include those grown in Argentina, Australia, Chile, New Zealand, South Africa and

OAK: The traditional wood used for making wine barrels. Oak barrels are used to age a wine and over time soften its tannins. It can also be used to impart flavour into a wine which can be both very prominent in a wines style and also very subtle depending on the quality of oak used. The more expensive French oak traditionally adds a more restrained character than its American counterpart which is much cheaper. French Oak can add a cigar box, tobacco-ish character while American oak is more often more reminiscent of a sweeter vanilla and cedar wood character.

OLD WORLD WINE: Wine produced in regions where the arts of viniculture first originated, notably France, Italy, Spain, Portugal,

OPULENT: Just as you'd imagine. Indulgent, rich, luscious and bold.

PALATE: The flavour or the taste of a wine is described as often being 'on the palate' As a wine travels through the mouth, it makes contact with all parts of the mouth causing numerous sensations that reflect the acidity, tannins, sweetness and flavours that make up of the wine.

PHYLLOXERA: Tiny root lice that attack Vitis vinifera (main group of wine producing variations of vine) roots. These vineyard pests became widespread in both Europe and California during the late 19th century and spread throughout the wine growing regions of the world. The few exceptions are the vineyards of Chile and

QUALITÄTSWEIN: The designation given to German wines of better quality.

REDUCTIVE: A wine yielding a somewhat sulphurous aroma, usually caused by being kept in airtight containers during fermentation.

RESERVE/RISERVA/RESERVA: Wine that has been aged longer, has higher alcohol levels and is better quality. Only the term "Reserva" for Spanish wines, however, has any official standings or requirements.

RESIDUAL SUGAR: The amount of unfermented grape sugar that is left a finished wine, causing it to have a sensation or degree of sweetness.

SECOND LABEL: Most of the top wine estates produce more wine than is required for their flagship wine and therefore the excess is often used to produce a second wine which although may not conform to quite as high standards as the first wine will often share many of its characteristics and qualities but at a considerably

SECONDARY FERMENTATION: The process that creates the bubbles in sparkling wine. After a wine has been made, a small amount of yeast and sugar is then added just before the bottle is sealed which then reacts to begin the fermentation process once again. The yeasts once again start fermenting the sugars in the wine and produce both more alcohol and carbon dioxide. As the bottle is sealed the gas cannot escape and therefore it dissolves into the wine creating the bubbles.

STANDARD: The most common wine bottle size of all, holding 750ml.

STRUCTURE: The structure of a wine is made up from the core components of a wine namely acidity, tannin, alcohol, and sugar. The related mouthfeel produced should be balanced whereas an unbalanced lacking in one or more of these components will be said

SUR LIE: The French term for wines aged "on the lees". A wine kept in contact with the dead yeast cells after they have fermented a wine rather than being filtered away will keep a wine fresh and can also enrich and add a bit of body and depth. The most common use of this method is in the production of the wines from the Muscadet region in the NW of France.

TANNINS: Found mostly in red wines, these are the chemical compounds that produce the drying sensation drinkers experience on their gums.

TERROIR: Although a French term it is used throughout the wine industry to describe the soil, climate, and topography of a specific site and in turn the character imparted on to the wine distinguishing it from other wines made elsewhere.

TOASTY: A wine that's been oak-aged in medium-plus toasted oak. But don't expect a "toasty" taste; you'll get lightly burnt caramel in

ULLAGE: The space between the surface of the wine and the top of the barrel, or between the wine and bottom of the bottle's cork or cap. **VARIETAL:** A wine produced from a single type of grape and named after that specific variety (a blended wine, by contrast, combines two or more grape varieties after separate fermentation).


VINIFICATION: The process of turning grapes into wine

VINTAGE: The year in which grapes are grown and almost always harvested. French wines with 2017 on the bottle will be produced from grapes grown from spring to late summer 2017 and will be harvested from late August to early October, depending on

VITICULTURE: The science, production and study of grapes.

YEAST: The vital micro-organisms that convert the grape sugars in a wine into alcohol, producing both heat and carbon dioxide in the process, which is known as fermentation. The primary yeast used in wine production is saccharomyces cerevisiae, the very same as the yeast used in both bread and beer making.

YIELD: The quantity of grapes or wine produced per area of vine Higher yields will usually result in more diluted flavours as the concentration of flavour per vine is spread across a higher number of grapes. By controlling a crops yields a wine producer can manage both the quantity and quality of their wines.

MR.WHEELER'S CASUAL TASTINGS

Our casual tastings are just that, casual, walkaround events with the wines laid out for you to taste at your leisure and decide upon your favourites. These events are offered free of charge to our customers and usually consist of a dozen or more wines to taste following a theme, perhaps a producer, regional or varietal focus. We also host such tastings to showcase new wines which have recently join the Mr.Wheeler wine list.

Whilst these events are complimentary, you are required to book in advance as space is limited. We often run multiple repeat events over consecutive evenings to ensure as many guests as possible can taste the wines.

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Tutored tastings usually run for approximately one hour and will focus on the wines of a producer, a particular style of wine or showcase some of the world's finest, rarest (and yes, most expensive) wines.
